Florida Association of Orthotists and Prosthetists (FAOP) Letter

Valarie O'Brien, CPO, LPO – Treasurer, Florida Association of Orthotists and Prosthetists discussed the letter referencing Rule 64B14-5.005, F.A.C.

Steven Mersch was also present and provided some history related to the beginnings of the CPR certification.

Via the letter, the Florida Association of Orthotists and Prosthetists (FAOP) requested the following:

- That the CPR mandatory requirement be taken away.
- That a CPR course be kept as qualifying continuing education credits for those who need it.
- That the number of hours taken to complete a CPR course reflect the same on the continuing education transcript.

Public Comment - Eugenio Silva, License number POR 87 noted he was in favor of FAOP's position.



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Anne Dubois noted that she agreed with FAOP's request to ensure hours awarded for a CPR course reflect directly with how long the course takes to complete. She also agrees with the request to make it a requirement at the clinic level, and not at the Department level.

Michael Wright also noted that he agreed with the idea to provide the freedom of choice to the practitioner to take the course as needed. He also agreed with the idea that hours awarded for a CPR course should reflect directly with how long the course takes to complete.
